Subject: Gwent PCC Outlines His Vision for Policing and Community Safety

The Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Gwent has pledged to "work with key partners to prevent crime" as he outlines his vision and priorities for policing and community safety in the Gwent Police area .

Gwent PCC Jeff Cuthbert represents the people of Gwent by making sure the service provided by the police is efficient, effective and economical. To ensure that the policing needs of our communities are met, the Commissioner is consulting with the public before formally issuing a police and crime plan which sets out his key priorities for Gwent over the next four years.

Today, the Commissioner is taking the new step of issuing his initial thoughts about his Police and Crime Plan for Gwent ahead of the formal process. This is so that elected representatives, public service bodies, the voluntary sector and interested individuals can have the opportunity to provide any comments or ideas they might have at this early stage.

Mr Cuthbert has said that his thoughts on the current direction of travel make it implicit that the following are key considerations:

- Improving further partnership working with other public services and the voluntary sector to support joint working with the work of Gwent Police in preventing crime;
- Building and maintaining cohesion and communication with all communities within Gwent so that people feel confident that the Police understand their varied needs;
- Examine police visibility and accessibility with the Chief Constable to ensure that uniformed presence is organised and deployed as effectively as possible;
- Getting the balance right between provision and reassurance, which includes having well located Police Stations and the utilisation of all modern forms of communication and transport to ensure officers can provide an efficient and effective service;
- And building a strong and positive relationship with the Welsh Government to ensure that effective schemes which support policing, such as the numbers of PCSOs in Gwent, are maintained.

Jeff Cuthbert's Police and Crime priorities for Gwent will reflect the key issues raised with him during the recent PCC election campaign as well as taking full account of other criminal and general well-being issues. The four priorities which will form the backbone of Mr Cuthbert's new police and crime plan are:

1. Crime Prevention - Working with key partners to reduce levels of crime which will lead to having fewer victims.

2. Providing Support for Victims of Crime - Whilst the PCC's main focus will be on preventing crime, he will also look to provide the best service possible for victims of crime with a particular focus on victims of serious harm. He will also take into account the growing menace of cyber-crime.

3. Dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) - Working with our other partners to tackle ASB which includes issues such as nuisance neighbours, vandalism and cold calling;

4. National (UK) Responsibilities - Ensuring that Gwent Police plays a full role in contributing to dealing with the national and regional threats from terrorism and organised serious crime.

The Police and Crime Commissioner for Gwent, Jeff Cuthbert, said: "The police cannot provide for the security and well-being of communities and citizens by itself and it's only through strong collaborative working with other key public services can we seek to provide the best possible quality of life for our citizens and particularly our most vulnerable. Through good joined-up working with key partners, we can reduce levels of

crime and have fewer victims.

My full Police and Crime Plan will go into much more detail but I intend, at this time, to base its approach on these key objectives and proposed priorities. I'm keen to receive initial observations from any organisation or individual that wishes to comment at this stage."

The full Police and Crime Plan for Gwent must be in place by the end of March 2017 following a period of formal consultation with the public. - Former Welsh Government Minister, Jeff Cuthbert, was elected as the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gwent on Sunday May 8 th 2016. Having held the position of Welsh Assembly Member for Caerphilly since 2003, he stood down to run for PCC.
- The Commissioner is responsible for representing the people of Gwent and making sure the service provided by the police is efficient and effective. This is done by holding the Chief Constable to account for the delivery of local policing; setting and updating a police and crime plan; setting the force budget and precept; regularly engaging with the public and communities; and appointing, and where necessary dismissing, the Chief Constable.
- The Commissioner has a number of specific duties and responsibilities. This includes setting the strategic direction and accountability for policing; managing the police estate; working with partners to prevent and tackle crime and re-offending; invoking the voice of the public, the vulnerable and victims; contributing to resourcing of policing response to regional and national threats; and ensuring value for money .

### **IN IT TO WIN IT: 2 WEEKS LEFT TO APPLY FOR CASH SEIZED FROM CRIMINALS**

**Community projects in Gwent only have two weeks left to apply to the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for a share of £150,000 in cash seized from criminals and from the sale of unclaimed found property.**

The clock is ticking and applicants only have until 4pm on Friday 22nd July 2016 to submit their bids for a share of the cash from Gwent PCC Jeff Cuthbert's Partnership Fund. The grant scheme is funded by the proceeds of crime awarded to the police and from the sale of unclaimed found property. It's open for bids from charities, voluntary organisations and community groups involved in activities that have a positive impact on their communities in preventing crime and anti-social behaviour.

Each group will be able to apply for between £250 and £10,000 from the £150,000 available and will need to demonstrate how their project will deliver against specific areas of focus highlighted by the Commissioner which include preventing crime; protecting people from serious harm; taking more effective action to tackle anti-social behaviour; and providing better opportunities for some of the most vulnerable and excluded people in the community.

Since the Partnership Fund was launched by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner three and a half years ago, nearly £500,000 has been awarded to 150 community projects across Gwent. The money retrieved has usually been obtained through illegal means such as drug dealing.

Urging community projects to bid for the funding, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gwent, Jeff Cuthbert, said: "I am looking to fund projects which can support front-line policing in the prevention of crime and anti-social behaviour and which offer opportunities for people who are disaffected or disengaged. I want this money to have a real positive impact on the lives of some of the most vulnerable people in our communities."

## Changes to bus services in Caerphilly county borough

From Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> July and Monday 1<sup>st</sup> August, there will be changes to many bus services within Caerphilly county borough. For some services, there are only minor alterations to times or a change of operator whilst for others there are major revisions to routes and timetables.

This leaflet provides a summary of changes to all services.

### Who is making the changes?

Since deregulation in 1986, most bus services in the county borough are planned by bus operators and provided on a commercial basis. The council does not have any control over routes, timetables, fares or other operational matters.

Some routes in the county borough are not commercially viable and the council is able to provide financial assistance to operators by letting contracts through a competitive tendering process. These routes tend to be during the evenings, on Sundays and Bank Holidays as well as those to smaller communities.

The council has recently re-tendered all routes it supports and many of the changes are a result of this. Bus operators have also taken the opportunity to make some revisions of their own from the same date.

### Why are bus services being changed?

Most of the changes have been made to maintain a comprehensive network across the county borough. Some services have also been changed for the following reasons:

- **To improve reliability**  
Some routes have become unreliable over the past few years and where possible timetables have been altered to help buses run to time.
- **To maintain/improve connections**  
As well as improving reliability, timetables have been designed to improve and maintain connections where possible. e.g. On Sundays route C has been amended to provide better connections to Cardiff.
- **To enhance services where passengers numbers are increasing.**  
In 2011, a number of changes were made to Sunday services. On some routes passenger numbers have increased by up to 25% so the frequency of some timetables has been enhanced. On Sundays Routes 26, 151 & B will operate every hour throughout most of the day.
- **As part of the council's budgetary savings requirements**  
Unfortunately, the council has had to make some savings from its bus subsidy budget as part of its savings requirements for 2016/17. While we've endeavoured to keep this to a minimum, as a result some lesser used journeys on some services have been withdrawn.
- **To answer your requests**  
In October 2015, the council and Bus Users Cymru held a number of drop-in sessions across the county borough. Over 100 comments were received and some of the changes are a result of your suggestions. They include:
  - Extending Route H to serve Aldi in Caerphilly
  - Diverting Route 26 around Parc Nantgarw during the evening and on Sundays
  - Improving the daytime reliability of Route 151
  - An earlier bus on Sundays on Route 1 from Rhymney Bridge to Bargoed.

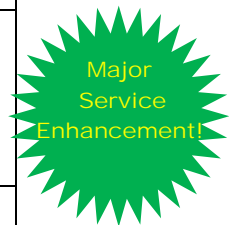

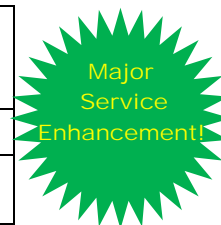
