On a beautifully sunny day back in August I was greeted with a breathtaking scene at Ystrad Mynach Park. On the banking, like spectators swaying in the breeze, were hundreds of sunflowers.

Our sunflower project was a huge success at Ystrad Mynach.

We commissioned Caerphilly County Borough Councils Park Services to create sunflower fields at three sites within the community. These areas were not only created for visual impact but more importantly to help feed our birds through the winter months, and it certainly has been a hard winter for them.

David Beveridge, Caerphilly County Borough Councils Urban Environment Awareness Officer has undertaken a couple of bird ringing sessions at the park to track and monitor their movement and well being.

Unfortunately due to a very wet summer, our other two sites failed at Glyngaer School and Coed Top Hill Landfill, Llancaiach. However, it is a case of trial and error and as it is an ongoing project Dave Beveridge will attempt to develop other more suitable sites and will return to Llancaiach using a different seed mix.

Gelligaer Roman Heritage Project





What did the Roman's ever do for us? Well, after 3 years of hard work, the Roman Heritage Project Group has secured funding (from the Welsh Assembly's Rural Development Scheme and the Heritage Lottery Fund) to use our rich history to help put Gelligaer on the map.

The project intends to increase people's awareness of the sites associated with the Roman period in a variety of ways including:



- Road-side panels etc to explain where the stone fort was and what it looked like
- Education packs for use by local schools
- A self-guided audio tour walk and a family clue trail around the various sites within the village to help inspire any budding Indiana Jones' out there
- An improved web presence
- Public celebratory events

The Roman Heritage Group has engaged a locally based company (Can Do Team) to help deliver the project.
