






It has been a privilege and an honour to have served Gelligaer Community Council as Chairman for the past year.

The Roman Fort Interpretation Project is very near completion.



Guide books, walk leaflets and educational packs have been printed and are available at the Gelligaer Community Council Office, Neuadd St Catwg, Local Libraries, Caerphilly County Borough Council Offices, Llancaiach Fawr and many other tourist attractions throughout Wales. Educational packs have been distributed to schools throughout South East Wales. Funding for this has been received from the Heritage Lottery, WAG and the Community Council. The fencing is up and the clue trail and viewing panels are about to be installed.
