

Last year Gelligaer Community Council sponsored CCBC's Bands in the Park at Ystrad Mynach Park and Cascade Playing Fields. Due to atrocious weather at the beginning of July, we moved the band and the few spectators into the Cascade community centre, where they enjoyed cream teas, carrot cake and music played by Rogerstone Brass Band.

Tiryberth War Memorial

After several weeks of consultation with local residents and many an Armistice day service spent sinking into the muddy grass, it was felt that Tiryberth memorial was deserving of a proper pathway and hard standing for its visitors. Gelligaer Community Council co-coordinated the project and part funded it along with Caerphilly County Borough Council. And what a difference it makes, giving much easier access to all, including wheelchair users. It was finished in time for last November's Armistice Day, and many who attended the service commented on how much better and safer the site was now.



Gelligaer ABC Boxing Club

Gelligaer ABC Boxing Club first started in the Harp Hotel, Gelligaer, during the late 1960's, and has been operating for nearly 45 years.

Its doors are always open Monday - Friday 5.00 -7.00pm.

It's mainly a boxing club but a few youngsters, male & female, attend training session simply to keep fit. It is widely used by youths and adults with a membership of approx 40, which include a few disabled children.

The club has produced many champions over the years, but more recently include:

- Lauren Price 69 kilo (17yrs old) very successful female boxer ranked No.3 in the world
- Kyron Jones 60 kilo Gold medallist in the British School Boy Championships
- Ryan Williams 52 kilo Silver medallist in the British School Boy Championships
- Morgan Palmer 54 kilo Bronze medallist in the British School Boy Championships
- Dai Davies has won many WABC Championships

Tiryberth Mosaic

The front to Tiryberth Primary School is much improved and welcoming, thanks to the children and local residents of Tiryberth. They have created a bright, vibrant and meaningful mosaic, which depicts local landmarks such St Catwg's Church and Hengoed Viaduct along with other images such as children, pencils and wildlife. The designs were the children's and residents' own ideas.



Many hours, days, weeks, and months (and many little hands!!) were spent in piecing the mosaic together, firstly on tables, then spilling out into the hall, until it was finally ready to fix outside. And it looks amazing not just for the school but for passers-by too. Conscious of the environment and the necessity to recycle in this day and age, the mosaic was constructed from natural, recycled and reclaimed materials.

Sultan's Challenge

Friday 6th July saw the Sultan's Challenge once again taking place, but due to the potential of "Adverse" weather conditions we were unable to hold the event in Parc Penallta and it was decided to hold it at Caerphilly Leisure Centre as this was the only indoor venue big enough. To coincide with changes within Communities First, schools in Bargoed were included, along with the usual schools at Ystrad Mynach, Gelligaer, Hengoed and Tiryberth.

The children arrived excitedly, anticipating what lay ahead. They were split up into 7 groups which gave them the chance to build their confidence by mingling and participating with their peers from other schools.

Each group had a "leader" to take them to each of the 7 events, which were:

- Cricket supervised by the Sports Development team
- Team-building activities run by the Hub team
- A free play-station which included hula hoops, swing ball etc run by the Tri-County team
- Rugby station in conjunction with the WRU
- Keep fit circuit station with rowing machines and a variety of exercises
- Soft drink awareness group which identified drinks with high levels of sugar content
- Spots & Stripes station which included a variety of trust-building exercises and team building

The children appeared to thoroughly enjoy the activities, with the Rugby event proving to be very popular. Soft drink awareness was very good, highlighting the high sugar content in some of our most popular drinks. I think it taught the children that looks can be deceiving. Spots and Stripes also proved very popular among the participants and they really enjoyed working together on this event.

All in all the children had a whale of a time. They got to meet new friends and participate in new activities that they might not normally do. WELL DONE TO THEM ALL. At the end of the morning, the leaders nominated their top 3 students from each group, who were awarded medals by ClIr Martyn James. They all, however, deserved and received praise for participating and being good sports. All the children that participated received reflective sports bags, bottled water & fruit, sponsored by Gelligaer Community Council. I was unable to stay for the afternoon session, but have been informed by ClIr Martyn James, that it was equally as successful and enjoyable as the morning.
