239 Consultation – Expansion of Trinity Fields and Resource Centre

Members received and discussed Caerphilly County Borough Council's (CCBC) consultation on the proposed expansion to Trinity Field School on one of the last remaining green fields in Ystrad Mynach.

The proposed new building will provide additional facilities to accommodate growing demand for places and provide additional classrooms, specialist intervention areas and outdoor play space It will also house a new flexible hall, hydrotherapy pool and soft play facilities to increase provision on site which will also be considered for community use at suitable times in keeping with the curriculum timetable.

To future proof the current site by ensuring that it can cater for the changing and more complex requirements of those with Additional Learning Needs.

Cllr Martyn James stated that he wasn't opposed to the school's expansion and recommended that CCBC look for an alternative site and build a state of the art school fit for the 21st Century or consider implementing further satellite bases.

Cllr Martyn James highlighted the following:

- Since 2007 Ystrad Mynach have lost two football fields, two small rugby fields, a large rugby field and a cricket pitch to development.
- CCBC's preferred option is to make improvements to a pitch at Sue Noakes Leisure Centre and provide two other pitches at Trinity Fields, which are of poor quality and often flood.
- 450 children would have to walk over a half a mile to the Sue Noakes Centre, crossing busy roads, before and after each game, which would also result in the displacement of children already using it for junior sports
- Building on a flood plain would exasperate an area already prone to flooding.

RESOLVED: Given that CCBC have a statutory duty to provide school places for children within the borough and the lack of finances to build elsewhere, Gelligaer Community Council accepted the proposed development as laid out in the document with an amendment that CCBC explore further details on providing a playfield for the children who will be displaced.

For the record Cllr Martyn James objected to the amended proposal, Cllr Jodie Postians abstained from the vote and six other members present voted in favour of the amended proposal.

240 Planning Appeal 20/0025/REF – 131 dwellings and associated works on land adjacent to Tiryberth Farm

Town and Country Planning Act 1990- Section 78

Comments on Appeal by Mr. & Mrs. Evans and Franks re Land Adjacent to Tiryberth Farm, Hengoed Rd., Penpedairheol, Hengoed:

Erect residential development up to 131 houses and associated works Ref: APP/ K6920/A/20/3257989 / Application Ref 20/0025/REF 18/0160/OUT

Members agreed to comment further to our original objection dated 26th April 2018, which will be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate, as follows:

'Gelligaer Community Council wishes to maintain its objection to this proposed development and to make the following additional comments.

1. It has been a longstanding policy of both Caerphilly County Borough Council and its predecessor Rhymney Valley District Council to preserve green wedges between villages in order to prevent their coalescence and to preserve the entity of each village. This development forms part of the green wedge between Penpedairheol and Cefn Hengoed. The application represents a considerable erosion of this green wedge. Although members are aware that each application is considered on its own merits they feel that allowing the appeal would create a precedent for further development on the green wedge, both opposite the site in question and on the same side of the road on land adjacent to Tir Jac Farm further to the north. The reasons for allowing the appeal would be advanced by further applications on the green wedge land.

There has been a growing awareness among the public of the valuable role played by green spaces and the countryside in close proximity to built-up areas in maintaining mental health, especially as a result of the coronavirus lockdown

2. This site is outside the settlement area in the adopted Local Development Plan, on a greenfield site. If built on it would be an incursion into the countryside. Arguments in favour of over-riding the Council's policies regarding development outside settlement areas rest on the failure of the council to provide a 5-year supply of housing land. However Welsh Government's guidance on this issue in Tan 1 is now subject to review and should not be given the weight it had previously.

There is an adequate supply of brownfield sites in the vicinity to satisfy local demand and therefore no need to develop a site in open countryside. The local demand for expensive larger houses for owner-occupation, as planned for this development, is likely to fall considerably in light of the severe economic recession widely expected as a result of the coronavirus crisis.

At the same time public awareness of the absolute necessity of maintaining and extending biodiversity, encouraging wildlife and insects and alleviating flooding to combat the effects of climate change mean that residential development on greenfield sites should not be allowed.

3. There are six hedgerows within the proposed site, all of which were assessed under the Hedgerow Regulations 1997. Out of the six hedgerows five qualify as "Important" hedgerows, the one hedgerow that did not qualify was the one located along Hengoed Road, however this still acts as an important wildlife corridor for species moving through the site. Therefore it is important that all hedgerows need to be retained and enhanced as part of the development and excluded from garden boundaries by suitable fencing. The breaks in the hedgerows for access roads will need to be mitigated, and existing gaps enhanced through enhancement planting. Hedgerows are so important as they hold invaluable habitat for many species. EU HABITATS DIRECTIVE asks if the development would affect any protective wildlife species? The proposed site is located due north of the community boundary of Cefn Hengoed and consists of two hedgerow bound fields.

Within 250m of Penpedairheol in close proximity of the boundary of the site there are areas of scrub and a pond and links to three sites of importance for nature conservation.

- (i) At Pottery Road Slopes west of Gelligaer SINC.
- (ii) At Tir Jac Slopes East of Penpedairheol SINC.
- (iii) Cefn Hengoed Hillside, North of Hengoed SINC.

The two fields proposed for development are linked to these SINCs and the wider landscape by the well-connected hedgerows.

This development could potentially harm the existing SINCs.

With regard to the protected Species, several were recorded to be using the site in the environmental survey.

There were 42 species of invertebrates recorded within the site during the survey. Pipistrelle bats were recorded to be using the boundary and internal hedgerow between the two parcels of land this being the most heavily used by bats for both foraging and commuting.

All bats have their roost sites protected by law, in the survey report page 12 recommends that the foraging routes along the hedgerow are not only maintained but enhanced.

As you enter the farm access there are two semi mature trees noted in the environmental survey report that have the potential of a small number of bats roosting beneath the ivy cladding on the trunks of these trees.

During the site meeting an officer said that the hedgerow on the right would have to be destroyed to allow access to the proposed site, however within the environmental report it was suggested that the farm access was to remain and the hedgerows remain in situ and an alternative access be made to the site, and in so protecting the valuable ecology of the area'.
