Minutes of the ORDINARY Full Council Meeting held on Wednesday 19th October 2022 7.00pm at Gelligaer Community Council Office in a MULTI-LOCATIONAL format in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021.

Chair Cllr Martyn James welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited Mr Paul Cooke to speak

79 Solar panels, storage and software – Mr Paul Cooke, CCBC's Decarbonisation Officer

Members learnt about solar panels through the installation of a solar farm on Hendai Farm, Gelligaer back in 2016 which saw 28 hectares (the size of approximately 46 football pitches) developed to generate power to 3,000 homes. It also meant Gelligaer Community Council received over £41k which we used to gift all our primary schools with solar panels. With climate change at the top of our agenda with the planet warming already destroying human and animal habitat and an underspend on last year, members were keen on installing additional solar panels on schools that have extra south facing roof capacity and installing learning resources, tools and technology to monitor and understand energy generated and usage from the solar panels.

Increasing electric vehicle points at schools and solar vehicle activated signs (VAS) was also discussed.

A member suggested installing solar panels on our toilet roof in Ystrad Mynach to save on energy costs but also to promote green energy, which in a prominent place like the town, which has a high footfall, was an excellent idea.

It was explained that £20k over 3 years had been budgeted for reducing energy . Mr Paul Cooke explained that he would discuss options with Paul Rossiter, the new Water & Energy Officer and either he or Paul would return to a future meeting to discuss options.

Mr Paul Cooke was thanked for his attendance, and he subsequently left the meeting.

Chair Cllr Martyn James invited Mr Keith Lewis Secretary to the Glanynant Allotment to speak next

80 Glanynant Allotment Association - Potential Project

Mr Keith Lewis introduced himself and explained that Glanynant allotments had a membership of between 28-30 people and 54 half plots, with a few empty. The association were looking for funding for a variety of power tools to help with clearing the empty plots which required a lot of work to make more appealing to potential new members. It was established that for security reasons the power tools would not be stored on site and disclaimers signed by those using the tools. It was advised that he speak with his insurance company further on the issue of disclaimers and insurance for storing the tools at his home and using them on the allotment.

Members decided to discuss the matter under projects and would let Mr Lewis know the outcome in due course.

Mr Keith Lewis was thanked for his attendance, and he subsequently left the meeting.

(iv) Ystrad Mynach Christmas Fayre Saturday 19th November 2022

(a) RESOLVED: Council agreed that Santa gifts selection boxes or books at £1 per child. And 400 boxes be purchased, Surplus boxes can be gifted to our local food banks.
(b) RESOLVED: Council agreed to fund £1k this year to CCBC as a token of our contribution to the favre, in line with other town councils.

(c) RESOLVED: Council agreed to fund promotional products for the winter and spring fayre to the sum of £5k for children's bags, colouring gift sets, sewing kits, pens and memo pads

(d) Members agreed to front the stall throughout the day in turn. Cllr Catrin Moss will be helping Santa.

(a) RESOLVED: Council approved quote of converting two columns at £300 each, o/s The Harp for festoon lighting on 3 trees

(b) RESOLVED: Council agreed quotation for the installation of Christmas lighting, which includes the additional costs of erecting and supplying festoon lighting to 3 trees o/s the Harp.
