- Project 9 Ox Eye Daisy

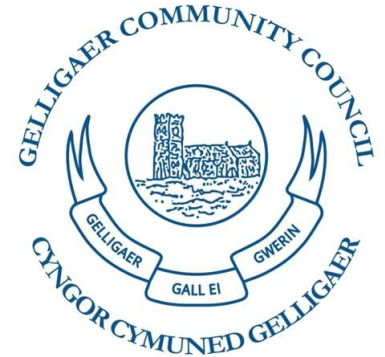
Planting now complete, 300 Ox Eye Daisy plug plants have been planted along the unmown verge of Hengoed Avenue
